Quartet, with which in 2018 he released an album titled "Whatever". Leader of the music concept team Jerry & The Pelcian System with which in May 2019 releases its debut album. In his previous career, the musician has played on many Polish and international stages, including: at music festivals: Jazz Jamboree, Ferrara Buskers Festival, JazzJantar, Jazztopad, in the European Parliament in Brussels as part of EXPO2017. He was educated in such personalities as Greg Osby, Michał Kulenty and Zbigniew Namysłowski. He is an active musician and collaborated with musicians from around the world, including Thomas de Perguery and Nitin Sawhney. He is constantly looking for the most varied sounds. His style is deeply rooted in the European avant-garde.
