8. A Mask (Fraud)

As a final desperate act, before the Mages can seal the last of the demon away, the fox uses one last trick. It imprisons itself onto the King's baby son – the heir to the throne.

The battle is ended. The triumph is bitter sweet. The damage to the kingdom is extensive. The King orders his men to scatter the 8 pieces far away where nobody will find them.
